Minutes of the Annual Parish Meeting held at 7.00pm Tuesday 1st March 2005 at the Jubilee Lounge Bill Shone Leisure Centre High Street Melbourne.

Present: Cllrs Statham (Chairman) Cllrs Beard Dunnicliff Carroll Collyer Dunnicliff Hicklin Jackson Sharp Smith Statham Willmore The Clerk three Public and two Press.

Apologies. Cllrs Freeman and Hatton.

Minutes. The Minutes of the meeting held on Tuesday 2nd March 2004 which had been circulated were signed by the Chairman as a true record.

Audited accounts for year ending 31st March 2004 were approved.

Any other business.

Mr Tom Scanlon expressed concern DCC is turning the Youth Centre at Packhorse Road into a full time Adult Education Centre to serve Melbourne and the outlying district with the result that Puddleducks and Phoenix have to find alternative accommodation. The DCC move will also cause traffic problems at Packhorse Road and possible child protection issues. Cllr Harrison explained the DCC policy and reasons for the move. The two schools have no surplus capacity so Puddleducks will move to St Marys Hall in Church Street at the end of April and Phoenix will discontinue due to reduced numbers.

Mrs Eileen Hardy asked

dropped kerbs be provided for wheelchair users in Kings Newton, the damaged headstone at the cemetery to the two young girls lost in the Flood is repaired and Severn Trent check the sewers at Main Street for noxious smells. Several defective lights reported to DCC have not been repaired.

Mr Gordon Hallam thanked the Parish Council for clearing the pavement in front of his house in Blackwell Lane whilst at the same time expressing frustration at the negative attitude of the County Council and its reluctance to be of any help over such Highway matters. Cllr Harrison had presented DCC with a 115 signature petition raised by Mr Hallam to have the footpath to Wilson cleared. Leic CC had received a petition from the residents of Wilson to get the path cleared.
