Minutes of a Meeting of the Melbourne Parish Council held at 7:30pm Tuesday 6th Dec 2005 at the Bill Shone Leisure Centre High Street Melbourne.

356 Present: Cllr T Statham (Chairman) Cllr Collyer Dunnicliff Hatton Hicklin Jackson Moore Sharp Smith Statham and Wood The Clerk Cllr Harrison PC Staley nine members of the Public and two Press.

358 Public Participation.

Police Matters PC Staley

Four sheds broken into but nothing was stolen.

Thieves are now capable of locating laptops left inside cars in hibernation mode by using a mobile phone - one person from Nottingham arrested and another identified

The problem of nuisance youths and girls at Potter Street, Coronation Close playarea, and George Street will be addressed. A resident of Coronation Close stated her husband had been surrounded by 20 young people whilst in his car and threatened with stabbing and it unsafe to go out or for children to use the play area when there is a mob of 50 to 60 young people are in the area. PC Staley has met with the leader of the Athenaeum with a view of having two CCTV cameras in Potter Street linked into the screens in the Internet Café. If the problems with nuisance youths persist applications will be made for Section 30 ASBOs.

Young people from Chellaston are bringing alcohol into the town. The increased frequency of buses from Chellaston, and moving the last bus time from 11.30pm to 1.30am has further excassabated the problem.

Suggest a meeting between the Police, Pub Watch, Crime and Disorder Partnership, and Parish Council to consider nuisance youths and the effect of the new licensing hours.

Duties redefined to concentrate on Melbourne and assist Aston and Weston.

The Police House in Ashby Rd will be ready December19.

Cllr Smith reported four complaints of nuisance youths at Coronation Close acting in an aggressive, rude and threatening manner.

Public- Mrs Hardy - need completion date for gas workings at Commerce Street. Light out on Derby Road opposite The Laurels. Thanks for trimming trees at the Lilypool and tidying up the car park.

Mr R Bingham. Life is made intolerable for residents of Potter Street by nuisance boys and girls congregating outside the Internet Café. Banging on windows, chewing gum in street, girls fighting and rowdy and rude behaviour. Five months have passed since promise of CCTV. A proper doorman is needed at the Athenaeum and the leader is not concerned about what happens outside. Request immediate action be taken.

Mr Canavan asked if a meeting had been fixed with DCC the new bus arrangements.

Cllr Harrison

DCC and SDDC matters.

There will be a meeting 9.30am Friday December at the Leisure Centre and a site meeting at Castle Square with a decision maker from Arriva, DCC, SDDC and PC to try to resolve the problems caused by the new bus arrangements.

Cllr Harrison assured Mrs Blatch that he is urging DCC to include funds for completing the pavement at Cockshut Lane in next years budget.

Cllr Harrison has been invited to the Athenaeum on December 13th to meet the management of the Internet Café

A new light will be placed in Victoria Mews to combat anti social behaviour, where chips have been stuffed into a central heating flue to block it. A second light has been requested from SDDC.

DCC car parking study disappointing. Off street parking must be sought if there is no on street left.

Asks Parish Council support for better facilities for the performing arts. The Leisure Centre should be de-listed, sold for development and the cash raised levered into a new facility elsewhere in the town.

The Airport Master Plan put off until end of January, replies by the end of April.

Michala Benson for NEMA explained the plan had been delayed to allow for more consultation. Cllr Collyer asked for Park and Ride numbers to the airport to be included as agenda item at next meeting.

The appalling behaviour of young people at night at the Market Place, Cockshut Lane, Coronation Close, Browns Field, and High Street car park exacerbated by the last bus to Chellaston put back to 12.25am, is now on such a scale SDDC and the Police need to re introduce the sec30 Asbo,s immediately. He had witnessed a mob of 60 outside the Chip Shop and drunken youngsters lying in the street.
